Temple City Youth Development has been in existence for over 30 years, having been founded by Bill Perini and daughter, Kathy Perini. The popular program is important for our youth and their futures.

Four to five hundred students participate yearly in the programs. Over the years an impressive alumnus maintained their common thread of experience better understanding themselves and the world through the Youth Development experience.

All programs are jointly sponsored by the Youth Foundation and the TCUSD. Financial support is provided by the PTA, service organizations, donations, school district and fund raising projects. No student is denied the opportunity to participate in the program because of his or her financial limitations.

Selection of the students includes, but is not limited to a high level of self-discipline, self control and respect for others. Also, the student's willingness to accept his/her share of responsibility as a member of the group, acceptable behavior, and a positive attitude, being able to adapt to different environments including changes in food and living arrangements.

Some of the trips that are provided through Youth Development are the California Heritage Trip for 4th graders (which only costs \$350 for the entire week), Marine Biology for 6th graders, Astrocamp for 8th grade, and Washington D.C. for 5th grades.
