THIS TUESDAY

Our featured speaker for the day was Jack McRae. He is a volunteer with Boy Scouts of America, a member of the Board of Directors, and is the Lucky Baldwin District Chairman. He oversees the scouting movement from Arcadia to Azusa, and Sierra Madre to El Monte. He is married with three sons, two are Eagle Scouts and one is almost there. Jack is an attorney and former Info Technology Executive. He is an excellent spokesperson for BSA.

There are 3.5 million Youth and Adult volunteers in scouting, including 1,261,340 boys ages 6 to 10 in Cub Scouts, 840,654 boys ages 11 to 17 in Boy Scouts & Varsity Scouts. There are "Troops" (Boys 11-17) and "Crews" (Youth 12-21) that make up scouting. The progression in scouting is Scout, Tenderfoot, 2nd Class, 1st Class, Star, Life, and Eagle Scout. The overall goal in scouting is to be a 1st Class Scout.

The model of scouting is "To prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Law". A Scout is: trustworthy, loyal, helpful, friendly, courteous, kind, obedient, cheerful, thrifty, brave, clean, and reverent. The Scout Oath is "On my honor I will do my best to do my duty to God and my country and to obey the Scout Law; to help other people at all times; to keep myself physically strong, mentally awake, and morally straight."
